

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

The Master of Science in environmental management degree at Hardin-Simmons University has been designed to give you the experience, analytical skills, and knowledge necessary to make you an effective environmental professional.

Students doing internships will gain valuable experience in such diverse settings as Dyess Air Force Base, TCEQ, West Texas Utilities Co., local manufacturing facilities, and local school districts.

Each environmental management graduate student takes a minimum of three hours of special topics courses designed to provide valuable professional training and, in many cases,

professional certification. All of these experiences provide invaluable opportunities for hands-on application of the knowledge you will gain at HSU.

FLEXIBLE SCHEDULING

The course schedule has been prepared with your career plan and busy schedule in mind. The program can be completed in two years, and all classes are offered in the evenings or on weekends. If you are in the military or have job duties that involve travel, the faculty makes every effort to accommodate your special needs.

CURRICULUM

The environmental management curriculum, depending on your choice of a thesis or an internship, consists of 31-34 hours, including courses in:

- Human Technology and Environmental Degradation
- Environmental Risk Assessment
- Environmental Phase I Assessment
- Regulatory Aspects
- Seminar
- Pollution Detection
- Water Resources Management and Hydrology
- Toxicology and Industrial Hygiene

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT SIMULATION

While the program is designed for students with a natural sciences background, there are self-paced leveling courses in biology, chemistry, and geology for those with non-science backgrounds.

Graduates with undergraduate degrees in diverse areas, ranging from criminal justice to engineering, have succeeded in the program.
