

HSU Athletic Training Education Transfer Policy

Students transferring to HSU must meet the same AT admission requirements as any other student, including completion of Introduction to Athletic Training (ATTR 1310), admission application process, etc. Transfer students will also be required to complete all six Field Experience courses (ATTR 2321, 2322, 3321, 3322, 4321, 4322). Clinical experiences at other institutions will NOT be counted toward field experience requirements. **This program requires a minimum six semesters in residence at HSU.**

Athletic training “core” courses (see Table 1 below; any course with an ATTR prefix) will NOT be considered for transfer equivalency. However, university foundational curriculum courses (English, History, Psychology etc.) may be eligible for transfer credit after departmental review, according to the *HSU Undergraduate Bulletin*. Other athletic training “foundation” courses (see Table 2 below) may be eligible for transfer credit as described in the *HSU Undergraduate Bulletin* after review by the appropriate department and the AT Education director. Only Table 2 courses with a grade of C or above will be considered for transfer credit within the AT program.
