A French and German Course will be taught in Sophomore and Junior years.

The Course of Study for the Junior and Senior years will be prepared and published in the Catalogue at the close of the session.

The work of the College will be Christian education. Its founders have dedicated it to the promotion of Christian intelligence among the people of Texas and other states.

The Faculty will be composed of none but Christian men and women, whose purpose will be not only to develop the body and the intellect, but the spirit as well; to lead to high conceptions of Christian life and duty. The true aim of the managers will be to send out from Simmons College well developed mental and Christian character; young men and women trained not only for time, but for eternity.

Every department of the school—Classical, Scientific and Literary—will be under the control of competent teachers.

The school of music will be organized at once. New pianos will be supplied, and the whole placed under the management of an accomplished leader.

All the modern appliances for class instruction, such as maps, charts, globes, etc., will be provided, and every means used to enable teachers to give the most thorough instruction.

The buildings are all new, the rooms large, and will be comfortably furnished.

The girls will occupy the main building, with the President's family; the boys will occupy buildings rented for that purpose near the college grounds.

Each pupil will be expected to provide himself or herself with a pair of blankets, sheets, pillow-cases, towels and toilet soap.

The expense will be \$180.00 for ten months; \$90 to be paid at the beginning of the first term of the session; the other half to be paid at the beginning of the second term, which will be about the first of February. This will include board, with fuel, lights and washing, and tuition in the Literary Department. Music will be extra; \$50 per session of ten months, including use of piano.
