

Federal Compliance and Student Consumer Information Notification

In compliance with federal law, the following notification regarding consumer information is sent each semester to all enrolled students and employees. This notice contains links and information the University is legally required to convey to you, and we strongly encourage you to read it. 1. ABOUT HARDIN-SIMMONS UNIVERSITY

- <u>Cost of Attendance</u> COA is the amount it will cost a student to go to school. HSU calculates their COA to show the total cost for the school year (fall and spring semester). The COA is the estimate of tuition and fees, cost of housing and meals (or living expenses), cost of books, supplies, travel, loan fees, and miscellaneous expenses. Adjustments can be made to a student's COA with proper documentation.
- <u>Withdrawal Process</u> Students who wish to drop courses or withdraw from the University must secure the proper form(s) from the Registrar's Office and contact the Financial Aid Office.
- <u>Return of Title IV Funds</u> When a student withdraws, is expelled, or ceases to be a student at Hardin-Simmons University, the University is required by the Department of Education to determine what portion, if any, of that student's financial aid is to be refunded to the financial aid program(s) in which that student participated.
- <u>Refund Policy</u> Refunds will be made upon complete withdrawal from the University. (Does not apply to "Dropping Individual Classes.") This refund policy applies to **tuition only**. Any institutional loans or grants will be pro-rated along with the charges as seen by following the provided link. No tuition is refunded for individual courses dropped after the 8th day of a term (16 week Fall and Spring terms only). If a student is only taking one class, that would be considered withdrawing and the refund policy for such would apply.

- <u>Accreditation and Licensure</u> Hardin-Simmons University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to award Bachelor, Master, and Doctoral degrees.

- <u>Copyright Infringement Policies</u> It is the policy of Hardin-Simmons University that faculty, staff, administrators, and students shall strive to obey Intellectual Property laws and licenses.
- <u>Transfer of Credit Policies</u> Current Hardin-Simmons students wanting to take a course(s) at another institution will need to complete the **Application for Acceptance of Non-Residence Work** form prior to registering for the course(s) with another school.
- <u>Student Body Diversity</u> When James B. Simmons contributed to the founding of Hardin-Simmons University, it was his belief that education should be available to all students no matter their race, gender, or social class.
- <u>Institution Vaccination Policy</u> Texas legislation mandates that every new student and new transfer under the age of 22 to any Texas university, regardless of living on campus or off campus, will be required to have a Meningitis Vaccination.
- <u>Teach-out Plans</u> Whether a program is closing or not, students will be able to finish that program at HSU. This is also known as a "teach out."
- Adverse Action Brought Against the Institution When an enforcement action or prosecution is brought against a school by a state or federal law enforcement agency and a final judgment, if rendered, would cause an adverse action by an accrediting agency against the school; revocation of state authorization; or limitation, suspension, or termination of title IV eligibility is possible. 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7. HSU'S ANNUAL SECURITY AND FIRE SAFETY REPORTS

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act or <u>Clery</u> <u>Act</u> requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on or around their campuses on Clery geography and produce an annual report available to the public on October 1 yearly. 8. <u>HSU'S COMPLETION/GRADUATION RATES AND IF APPLICABLE TRANSFER-OUT RATE</u> OF CERTIFICATE OR DEGREE SEEKING, FIRST-TIME, FULL-TIME, UNDERGRADUATE <u>STUDENTS</u>

Institutions must annually make available to prospective and enrolled students the completion or graduation rate of certificate- or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time, undergraduate students. The data are to be available by July 1 each year for the most recent cohort that has had 150 percent of normal time for completion by August 31 of the prior year.

9. ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT DATA (EADA Report)

Each coeducational institution of higher education that participates in any federal student aid program and has an intercollegiate athletics program



must prepare an Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act (EADA) report and make it available upon request to students, potential students, and the public. HSU's EADA is managed by the Director of Athletics and/or the HSU Institutional Research staff. The report is available upon request via HSU Athletics or can be found on the Consumer Information Page of the HSU Website.

10. <u>STUDENT & PARENT RIGHTS UNDER THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND</u> PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of, and limits access to, student education records. The law affords students certain rights with respect to their education records. 18. TEXTBOOK INFORMATION

HSU does not differentiate between students receiving Title IV financial aid and those who do not. All HSU students are permitted to charge books and supplies at the HSU Bookstore up through the 8th class day or the first disbursement of aid.
